Novice | Carvers who have carved less than 5 years or have won 2 first place ribbons or 1 Best of Class in Beginners <u>in this show</u>. Cast feet will be allowed. Entries carved in a class are acceptable

Intermediate | Carvers who have carved 5 years or more or have won 5 first place ribbons or 1 Best of Class in Novice in this show. Cast feet are allowed. Other materials may be used for habitat, bases, structural purposes but must be hand formed. The use of real rocks, uncarved driftwood, etc. (for habitat or bases) is discouraged. Entries carved in a class are acceptable.

Open | Any carver may participate. This class is intended for advanced carvers who have won **8 first place ribbons or 1 Best of Class in Intermediate** <u>in this</u> <u>show previously</u>. Cast feet, real rock, uncarved driftwood, etc. will NOT be accepted. Entries carved in a class or from a kit or machine duplicated will NOT be accepted.

Rules of Entry and Competition

- 1. Every carving must have been completed within the 12 months immediately prior to the competition and may not be entered in the same competition in two successive years.
- 2. Every carving must be an original made by the carver.
- 3. More than one subject on a single base is considered **one** entry.
- 4. A competitor may not enter carvings in more than one class.
- 5. All entries must be made of wood. Glass eyes are acceptable. Subject to Class restrictions, other materials may be used as functionally required (e.g., hinges, hasps, drawer pulls, cane tips, etc.)
- 6. Any/all discrepancies are to be submitted to the

Kawartha Carving Competition by September 30, 2023 in writing with phone number, address and signature for review by the Competition Committee.

- 7. The judges and their immediate families (i.e., spouses and children) are not eligible for the competition.
- 8. Any entry may be re-assigned to another category at the discretion of the judges.
- 9. Carvings will be coded until judging is complete. Identification marks and signatures must be covered.
- 10. If a carving is the work of 2 or more people, all names must be on the registration and on any place cards or other references during the show. Judges will be made aware that the entry was the work of more than one person. Entries will be judged in the class applicable to the more experienced carver/painter.
- 11. Judging begins at 10:00 a.m. Saturday and is open to the public.
- 12. A woodburning (pyrography) entry is **not** eligible for Best of Class or Best of Show consideration.
